We have spare mugs for tea.



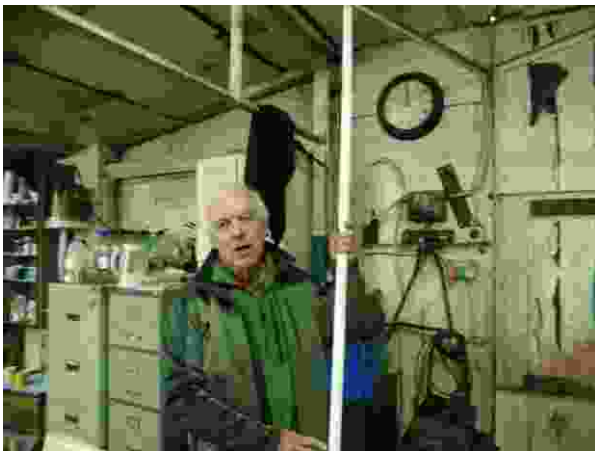
