


Three day working week issue

Now the insulation goes on Have you any idea how many sheep have had to be sheared to get that lot








The barrel cladding comes up from the bottom shop, with Paul Hyde riding shotgun

Mike starts applying the top coat






Darth Vader's helmet?? or is it a dome cover?








Dave gets to grips with his newly made fittings
